

#### Coats and school uniform

Our school playground is very exposed and children and staff really do feel the elements when outside. Although they may be waterproof, they are often not warm enough for this time of the year. Could you please check your child's coat, hat, scarf and gloves etc, before they return to school. Thank you.

If possible, warm grey tights are far more practical for their time in school as well as much warmer at this time of the year.
