



At times some children may need extra help in school. Children who experience difficulties may fall into one (or more) of four areas:




Our staff are trained to use a variety of teaching approaches that are based on research to promote understanding and progress. These methods ensure all pupils can access learning and are flexible to meet the needs of our pupils, including those with SEND.

Our SENCO Mrs Carli Bean leads on supporting children with SEND.

Concerns about pupils learning or interactions can be raised by parents or school. Together we discuss the concerns, share the information we have and then make a plan of action. This may include further observations, exploration of a child's work or discussions with outside professionals. We will share this information with you, so that we work together to have clarity about what we will do next.



Most children's needs will be met by high quality teaching in class by our staff. Some children need extra help to keep up with their classmates and may be included in 'Interventions'.

Fewer children will need a personal plan with targets which are monitored by the SENCO.

Very few receive individually funded support through an Education Health and Care Plan.

If a child is being monitored because they have Special Educational Needs, they will be included on our SEND Register and parents will be informed. If your child has SEND, you can expect to meet your child's class teacher once a term to discuss targets and support. For some pupils, this may occur more often. If we think another agency could help us to meet your child's needs you will be asked to give consent for them to work with school and your child.

- ⇒ Specialist Teaching Teams for City of York (Autism, Dyslexia, Hearing, Vision, Behavior and Physical disabilities)
- ⇒ NHS Health Services (Speech therapy, occupational therapy and physiotherapy)
- ⇒ Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (Limetrees, School Wellbeing Service.)
